# ADAPTATION FUNDING LANDSCAPE TOOL

### ABOUT THE TOOL

This user-friendly tool maps the adaptation funding landscape in Cameroon, using publicly available data on international public funding, programmes, projects, and actors, as of end-2024. It tracks where and how adaptation funding flows to the local level in Cameroon. Developed through a participatory approach, it is a living resource that will evolve over time. Users are encouraged to share feedback and contribute updates.

### WHAT HAS BEEN MAPPED AT THIS STAGE?

The tool focuses on funding streams for climate adaptation explicitly directed at the local level, i.e., funding with tangible implications for specific subnational areas.

### HOW WAS THIS MAPPING UNDERTAKEN?

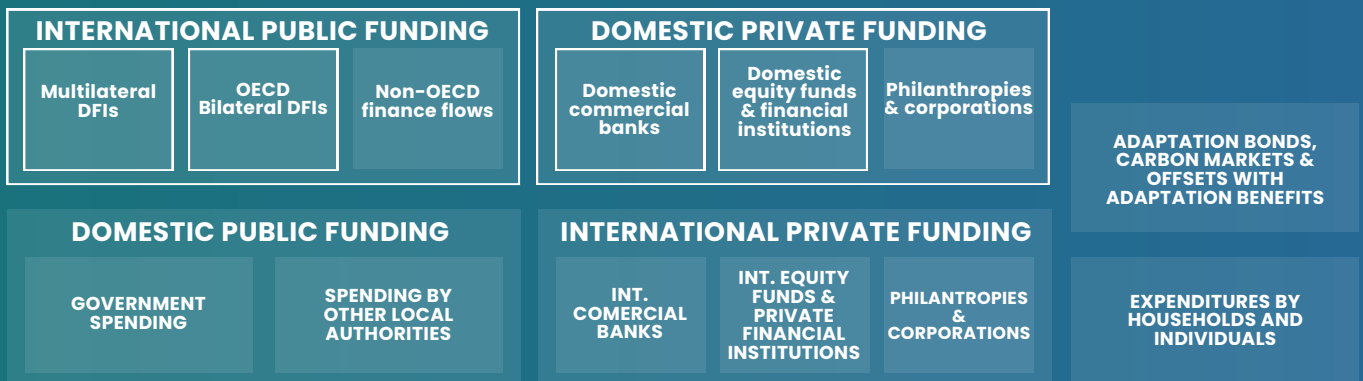
The mapping employed desktop research, 25+ stakeholder interviews and data extraction from sources such as the OECD-DAC and the International Aid Transparency Initiative.

### OUR OBJECTIVE?

The BRIDGE project, in collaboration with FEICOM and the University of Yaoundé, improves the quality of finance for locally-led and gender-responsive initiatives in Cameroon by strengthening the capacities of knowledge brokers and enhancing existing climate finance mechanisms, with learnings scaled beyond Cameroon.
